Each day begins with the Pledge of Allegiance and our Thank You Prayer.

Every day, a different child is the leader of the day, a very important role!

The leader holds the flag during Circle Time. The child may also lead the class to the very popular playground!

Each month the children will be introduced to a new color. The color will be reinforced through crafts and songs.



Mary Had a Little Lamb is our nursery rhyme for this month and the children will be learning this song, as well as making a craft to bring home and share with you. We also will be keeping some crafts to make into a Nursery Rhyme Booklet that each child will take home at the end of the school year.

Each month we will also introduce the children to a different shape. We will begin the year with the circle, as we are a Circle of Friends who help and share with each other every day.

Remember to have your child bring in a large backpack. Small backpacks are not big enough to hold the art work and notices that will be coming home. Please make sure you go through and empty your child's backpack each time he/she comes home from school. Please do not let your child bring toys or trinkets from home in his/her backpack.

We are a NUT-FREE CENTER. Please do not bring in any items containing nuts or which are manufactured in a facility that processes nuts. This includes snacks, lunches, and birthday treats.

When helping your child dress for school, keep in mind that he/she needs to get in and out of their clothing themselves. Keep it simple. Buckles and belts are very difficult for little fingers, and the children become upset when they have a hard time in the bathroom. This may be their first time away from you and they are learning to be more independent. By thinking of these situations in advance you will help make your child a happy, independent preschooler!

Some children may have difficulty separating from you as they get used to their new surroundings. Please try not to worry. They are in good hands. Some children may take longer than others to adjust, but we will help to make this transition as easy as possible. In no time at all, your little one will be running into school to be with his/her new friends!
